#### **Haswell Neighbourhood Plan**

The parish council has started work on a neighbourhood plan. Neighbourhood plans enable people living and working in an area to guide where and how future development happens.

Plans are prepared by the local community through their parish council, rather than by Durham County Council.

They must be supported by the local community through a referendum and once adopted, will be used by Durham County Council to make decisions on planning applications in the parish.

### What can a neighbourhood plan include?

The main purpose of a neighbourhood plan is to include planning policies for the use and development of land. This could include:

- Employment, such as allocating sites for business development.
- Housing, the plan could allocate sites for housing development and include policies which identify the types of homes that are needed.
- Transport, this could include extensions to cycle routes or footpaths.
- Natural environment, such as designating important open spaces to be protected from new development.
- Historic environment, such as identifying important local heritage assets.
- Design, the plan could include a design code to shape development.

In addition to planning policies, many neighbourhood plans include community actions which relate to activities that do not require planning permission, such as environmental enhancement projects.

#### What can't a neighbourhood plan include?

Neighbourhood plans cannot prevent development already agreed in the County Durham Plan and cannot cover strategic planning matters such as major infrastructure or minerals and waste development.
